They are well known in the local community for organizing Quiz Nights and other fund-raising events, and bring a wealth of experience to Bourne Lions.




## Lions Club of Felixstow

This idea is really taking off throughout the MD, with Loughborough Lions Club just carrying out their first glean in the village of Quorn. 50 kg of apples were rescued from trees in around an hour and a half by four and a half volunteers (half was Lion Mike's daughter Hannah). It's a great fun thing to do for all of the family and the otherwise wasted fruit was shared with John Storer House Foodbank, Fearon Hall Community Centre and the homeless charity Project 5,000.

Elsewhere, Lion President Bob and Lion Sue Crampton of Edwinstowe and The Dukeries Lions Club gleaned 61kg of apples with the help of their grandsons, which were donated to The Lifespring Centre in Ollerton.

Deeping Lions are taking donations of gleaned fruit and veg from local allotments and farms for redistribution over the weekend of 18/19 September (a fabulous idea as, let's face it, that is always a glut of runner beans that we can share at this time of year!).
