SUPPORTING BRAIN INJURY *RECOVERY*

One Million Steps for One Million Pennies

After a successful Charity Walk in 2019, the JOGLE Challenge, (John O'Groats to Lands' End), North to South, disabled Brain Injured Lion Zara Dyer MJF and her full time Carer and partner Lion Ian Brown MJF of the Bungay Area Lions Club are now on their "Side to Side" challenge.

On the 3rd of May 2022 they commenced walking West to East, from St David's (St David's Point), Pembrokeshire, Wales, to Ness Point, Lowestoft, Suffolk, England, arriving on the 2 July 2022 and this time just a mere 500 miles. They are hoping to raise one million pennies for their Registered Charity 3 million Steps an organisation that supports sufferers of Brain Injuries and their Carers. Funds will be used for further treatment and equipment that is not immediately supplied by the National Health Service.

In 2016, Lion Zara was only 29, working in the Caribbean when she suffered a freak seizure at the wheel of her car causing it to crash. This resulted in a TBI – six bleeds on her brain, paralysis, fractures to her neck, shoulder, back and upper part of her body. She had to be taught how to swallow, talk and walk again. If you want to follow her recovery, please visit: www.3millionsteps.org or the face book page 3 million Steps. Lion Zara will always suffer some form of disability, but she keeps smiling.

Lion Zara is a very determined young lady, she, and her partner Lion Ian, are now on the mammoth task of walking from St David's to Ness Point, Lowestoft, (estimated at One Million Steps) finishing the walk on the 2 July 2022. She hopes that the Charity Walk will raise One Million Pennies for fellow Brain Injury Sufferers and their very important carers. The funds will help to take the financial burden from Brain Injury survivors and their carers so they can concentrate on their recovery and once again live with dignity, self-worth and return to be valued member of society and their family.

On the 30 May 2022, Zara and Ian, with the help of the Chepstow and Caldicott Lions, crossed the River Severn Road Bridge and into England. Now their journey will take them through the Counties of South Gloucestershire, Wiltshire, Oxfordshire, Bedfordshire, into our District 105CE and onto Cambridgeshire, Norfolk, Suffolk and arriving at Ness Point, Lowestoft on Saturday 2 July.

When they reach our District, could consideration from the various Lions Clubs along their walking route to be able to meet Zara and Ian and offer some moral and social support, such as a cup of tea, somewhere to park their 2-berth motorhome overnight, where we can purchase LPG, use of a washing machine anything would be grateful. Zara's disability requires constant clean clothes, so the use of a washing machine and dryer is very





important. Perhaps some members would be able to help with conveying them back and forth to their parked motor home at various locations on the walking route. The estimated daily distance would be 10 miles and the daily walk normally commence at 7.30am and finish about 12.30pm. Depending on where the motor home is parked, lifts would be required from around 7.30am and

return to the unit at about 12.30pm. Everybody is welcome to join any part of the Charity Walk but please remember the Zara walks 2 to 3 miles per hour for 2 hours, then has a short rest before commencing the next part of the daily journey. As the daily walk progress Zara becomes very tired, so she is unable to speak as she struggles to concentrate on the walk. However, Lion Zara MUST have a 3-hour rest after each daily walk to heal and recharge her brain. In return, they are prepared to visit any Lions Club to give a short presentation about their walks and Zara's journey to recovery OR attend a Club event to recruit new members.



Full details of dates and the Charity Walk route will be sent to in divisional Clubs.

The overnight parking of the motor home will be on "wherever we can park" basis unless anyone can secure us a plot.

Hopefully Clubs will be able to support the walkers and join them on part of the journey.

The route of this long charity can be found on the website www.3millionsteps.org and daily walking diary on the face book pages 3 million Steps however times/dates are fluid due to Zara's medical conditions and walking aides.



Monies raised from the charity walk will be solely used for charitable use in connection with supporting Brain Injury Sufferers, their Recovery and ongoing Treatment and their very important Carers. The Charity is completely run by volunteers. If any Lions Club or member of the Lions family could offer further support, please consider sponsoring the daily estimated £50 running cost

Support for Ukrainian families arriving in Southwell and surrounding area.

Southwell & District Lions Club has teamed up with Southwell Town Council to establish a dedicated fund to help support Ukrainian families arriving in Southwell and the surrounding villages, including Farnsfield, Fiskerton, Rolleston, Morton, Upton, Bleasby, Thurgarton, Lowdham, Edingley, Kirklington, Halam, Hoveringham and Kirklington. The fund is to be used to purchase essential school related items such as uniform, shoes, trainers, sportswear, school bags, football boots and calculators etc.

The Town Council asked the Lions if they could manage the applications and payments to the arriving families or their sponsors as they are not allowed to make payments to individuals. The Lions readily agreed to help and, because the Council funds are for families settling in Southwell, added a further £1,500 from own its charitable funds so the scheme could be extended to all the villages in Southwell Lions' area, whether the children are going to the local village school or to Southwell Minster School.

Southwell Lions President, Nick Parr, said: "We have already donated £1,000 to the Lions International Fund for Ukraine, which is channelled to Lions Clubs in Ukraine and the surrounding countries to provide aid to Ukrainian refugees, and several of our members have been helping out at the Kirkby-in-Ashfield sorting warehouse, organised by Magda Wasiewicz of B-Sweet in Southwell, sending huge donations of food, medication and many other items so generously donated by our community.

"We can't imagine what these families have been through over the last couple of months and our hearts go out to every one of them. This new fund is a great way to support the families who have left their homeland and are being welcomed into our community. We were very keen to find a way to help them here, so were very happy when Southwell Town Council approached us to manage the fund on their behalf, and to add our own contribution so we can help even more of the youngsters when they start at their new schools."

Initially, Ukrainian families or their sponsors will be able to apply for up to £100 per child.



Some of the money donated to Magda of B-Sweet in Southwell for assistance with fuel for their Ukraine deliveries was used to purchase potatoes for the refugees and added to the deliveries. The Quiz in aid of the Ukraine raised just over £1,800. Thank you to all who participated in and enjoyable and worthwhile event.

Southwell Lions have supported two local scouts who are among 36 young people chosen to represent Nottinghamshire Scouts at the 25th World Scout Jamboree in South Korea in August 2023. Jayen Patel of the 1st Coddington Scout group and Grace Fieldwick of the 1st Farnsfield Scout group are busy fundraising to pay for the trip of a lifetime and Southwell Lions President Nick Parr was delighted to present them each with a cheque for £200 to help them on their way. The World Scout Jamboree takes place every four years and in 2019 was in West Virginia, USA. Likened to the Olympics of Scouting, in 2023 the event will be hosted by the Korean Scout Association. The two-week event is attended by over 50,000 people where the focus is on a sustainable world where everyone's welcome. To attend the World Scout Jamboree, each of the 3,000 UK participants must raise £3,600. This not only pays for their attendance but contributes towards helping young people from less developed countries.



Recognising the increase in mental health issues among young people, particularly because of the pandemic, Southwell Lions has donated to Enabling Hope, a newly established not-for-profit community interest company based in Southwell, that provides mental health support to young people and those who care for them. Southwell Lions President Nick Parr presented the cheque for £250 to Sally Falkner of Enabling Hope, which has been used to purchase a range of arts and crafts, therapeutic cards, and sensory toys, all of which support the therapies offered by Sally and her colleagues.

Southwell Lions' popular annual Easter Egg raffle has raised an amazing £1,700 thanks to the generosity of pub-goers in the town and at the Lions market stall at Southwell Market on Easter Saturday. Around 15 local pubs in Southwell and surrounding villages each raffled a giant Thorntons Easter Egg in the run up to Easter, while Saturday shoppers, including children, were able to take their chance at winning one of the giant eggs or a smaller egg on a tombola on Easter Saturday on Southwell's Market Square. The tombola was so popular that both giant eggs and all the standard eggs were won in record time! Says organiser Steve Foster: "Visiting all the pubs to ask them to display the giant Easter Egg and encourage customers to buy tickets to win them is a difficult job but someone has to do it. Many of the pubs have supported us over the years so it was great to have them involved again this year, helping us to raise a superb amount, which will be put to good use, supporting local charities and other good causes as well as international appeals through LCIF. The market stall is always popular with families, young and old and we're grateful to everyone who supported us."



Lions Club of Felixstowe

and the difficulties they face in their long journeys to safety. He explained that several families are being hosted by Felixstowe residents. This is of course only a short-term measure and more medium to long term arrangements are needed.

Lions are pleased that we will be responsible for the afternoon tea party to be held on Sunday 5th June in Hamilton Road to commemorate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee. There will be entertainments and children's games. Look out for further details in local press and on our Facebook page.

The Easter Egg Hunt in April on the seafront gardens went very well and just under £1200 was raised. Next year we hope to expand the hunt so even more children, and families, can enjoy the event.

The first of this year's Antiques and Collectibles sales was held last weekend on the Triangle. Despite a very wet and miserable morning, over £570 was raised and we thank all those who came along to support us. Hopefully the next sales will be held in better weather!


