Well done Lincoln Lions for having this dream some four years ago and finally seeing it come to fruition. The evening was slightly spoilt due to a

23-mile diversion as the A17 was closed on the way home for survey work.



On Saturday23rd September Sue and I attended the 43rd Charter anniversary of Stowmarket Lions where Lions Andrew Ward and Keith Cooper were both presented with well-deserved MJF's. A great evening of fun and friendship and thank you to Stowmarket Lions for



making us so welcome.

The District Governors team are aware that there is a problem getting the collected spectacles to Birmingham. The plan we have come up with to try and solve this issue is to hire a van and take these spectacles to headquarters from the clubs in Essex, Suffolk and Norfolk collecting on $31^{\rm st}$ October from drop off points and on the $30^{\rm th}$ of November, the same will apply to the clubs in Cambridgeshire, Nottinghamshire, and Lincolnshire. This plan was originally scheduled for the start of October but put back in order for discussions to take place at club meetings. We take the risk, you only owe us £1 for each one you sell, and you have until the end of the year (the quiz closes on 13th January, and many people buy them as stocking fillers).




