

Beccles and District Lions Club



In May we were asked to support the purchase of a bespoke Riser Recliner chair for a Wangford resident. The request was from Fiona Robinson, an Occupational Therapist with Suffolk CC. She told us that her customer was in her late 50's and has reduced mobility, swelling in her legs, fibromyalgia and has difficulty completing chair transfers. She is also registered severely sight impaired.

Beccles Lions Welfare Officer Phil Wright met the customer and Fiona Robinson at Wangford, and established that the lady had multiple medical problems, with a great deal of pain, and that a bespoke chair would alleviate her pain and discomfort and improve her quality of life. We were also aware that Southwold Lions had pledged £500 to support the purchase which was quoted at £2683. We agreed that the situation was urgent, and that we should help the lady. At that time, the Club were aware of requests to other charities and Clubs, but that there had been no response as yet. We therefore decided that we would order the chair, guarantee the full pur-

chase cost, and accept any future donations to reduce the Club's outlay.

Between the order of the chair and its delivery at the end of July Lowestoft Lions Club had contributed \pounds 500, the Southwold Trust had donated \pounds 500, and the Mrs L D Rope 3rd Charitable Trust had also contributed \pounds 400, leaving the Beccles Club to settle the \pounds 783 remaining.

The Club would like to thank the Carl Crowther from Beactive Mobility Ltd, for his prompt handling of the order which reduced the waiting time during the Summer Holiday season. The exercise brought together the combined generosity of Southwold Lions, Lowestoft Lions, The Southwold Trust and the Rope Trust, steered to a successful conclusion by Beccles and District Lions Club. The recipient and her Occupational Therapist are most grateful for the generosity shown, and much appreciative of the improvement to her comfort; both thanked all the donors for their kindness.

A successful co-operative exercise by our regions Lions Clubs and Charities.


Spalding V Glanford and Lindsey
