Beccles Bell Tower additional opening day

Beccles Town Council are pleased to announce that they have reached agreement with Beccles and District Lions Club to open the Bell Tower to visitors on Fridays, starting from Friday 13th August.

The Council's current team of volunteers, ably led by Diane Dungate and David Spink, currently open the Tower for tours on Saturdays in the Summer and Autumn. The Council are looking to maximise the opportunities for the increased number of tourists in the town this year to be able to access the Tower more than one day per week. The Lions Club are keen to operate the facility, both to show the service to the Town that is a hallmark of their organisation, but also to raise funds for the good causes that the Club supports in and around Beccles.

The Friday openings will be a trial period, with the Council and the Lions planning to review the outcome during the winter, with a view to further increasing the opening days in the 2022 Summer season.



Mayor of Beccles, Cllr Richard Stubbings, said "The Bell Tower is an iconic Town landmark, as well as being a significant tourist destination. I am delighted that the Council and the Lions are working together to increase the use of the Tower, and we hope that this will be mutually beneficial. I want to thank Diane and David from our current volunteer team for their support of the Lions as they prepare to open for the first time on Friday".

Lion Sandy Barr, President of the Beccles and District Lions Club, said "our Club have a commitment to service in our local Community, and to raising money to support deserving causes in Beccles. Getting involved in helping the Council to open the Tower fits well with both of these aims, and the Club members have embraced the opportunity and are looking forward to enabling more visitors to experience the fantastic view from the top of the Tower".

The Bell Tower will be open on Fridays and Saturdays, from 10.30am to 4pm, until the end of October. Tower tours cost £2.50 per adult (16 and over), and £1.50 for 4- to 15-year-olds (under 4s are free of charge).

Every year for as long as we can remember, except last year, the children who go to Holland Haven Primary School in Clacton make up and donate Harvest Parcels for Clacton Lions Club to distribute to those in need. The time and thought put into the contents of these parcels shows how community minded the children are, they usually write a personal note in them, and they are overjoyed when the recipient writes back to them. Welfare Chairman Lion Andrew and Lion Steve collected and delivered 115 parcels to residents.



At our first face to face meeting since the Covid pandemic started, as well as badging up new member Lion Iain McKenzie, we were pleased to make donations totalling £2,600 to the following worthy causes. We donated £400 to each of the 5 main food banks in Tendring. They are Clacton, Brightlingsea, Manningtree & District, Harwich Community and Walton & District.

£500 was donated to Clacton Veterans Club to help their fundraising for their Christmas Meals, and £100 was donated to Royal Ace Performance Academy to help their fundraising for their new uniforms. Vice President Lion Keith presented Clacton Veterans Club organiser Dave Bye with their cheque at their monthly Breakfast Club, after a hearty breakfast of course.



When our Asda Community Champion Amy, heard about our Club's plans to purchase sets of the Wild Tribes Books to donate to local primary schools, she suggested that we put forward a proposal to be included in the next Asda Foundation Green Token Scheme. What they do is feed the homeless in the Mansfield area, approximately 50 persons at weekends when no one else is available to do this and give them hopefully a warm meal with friends and colleagues often raiding their own larders and fridges to feed them. They came only asking for £100 so they could prepare for Christmas on 3 weekends culminating in the New Year weekend. Lesley and David were so humble and dedicated to this cause not making any judgements on who came for food. Lesley said some have drug and alcohol problems and some have family and mental problems. Her words-- Vodka keeps them warm. They also serve "soul food" and this is dished out with lots of love, patience and understanding. We as a lions group gave them £300 – and you know what Lesley left the room crying knowing she and her colleagues could give these people a warm Christmas.



You know Kindness does matter whoever you are. Whoever you are helping and no matter where in the world,

Braintree Lions held their annual 3-day REAL ALE FESTIVAL due to the Pandemic the date was changed to October. We scaled down the festival to 25 Ales and 6 Ciders and sold out of most beers and ciders. The event saw more than 500 people and realised some £3k profit. On Saturday we had an impromptu visit from our local MP James Cleverly. We aim to return to our usual date in June, the 9th-11th next year.

Stamford & District Lions President Gill and family went for the shave, and all went to plan. 5 of them had their heads shaved in support of Gill's nephew. He was blown away by it all and rather overwhelmed, but it lifted his spirits at a time when he needed it. He had a PET scan last week and will get his results soon, so we are all hoping that it is good news, and he can move on to the next stage of treatment.



We don't have final figures of amounts raised, but the evening itself raised thousands of pounds for The Blossom Charity in Eye and Gill has nearly £1,000 so far with more to come.

As with many charities, it's been a difficult two years for Rayleigh Lions. They have been unable to fundraise due to Covid restrictions but have still received many requests for help. Rayleigh Lions were able to donate over £4,000 to local good causes including Jack's sensory log cabin, Rayleigh REC Food bank, Rapid Response Appeal (which supports NHS workers), RNLI, East Essex Hackspace, KAOS Youth Club and Essex Deaf Children Society.

Since starting in 1974, Rayleigh Lions has raised and donated over £1 million to good causes in the Rayleigh, Hockley, Hullbridge and Rochford areas. In the last 5 years (prior to 2020) Rayleigh Lions have donated around £65,000 to local good causes, including -

- £15,000 towards a new minibus for the Hockley Day Centre
- £8,000 for a Breakout Area at Fitzwimarc School
- £5,000 towards refurbishment of two classrooms for hearing impaired pupils at Sweyne Park School
- £3,000 towards a new scanner at Southend Hospital
- £2,700 for one mission for Essex Air Ambulance

Lions Clubs of Southeast Essex (Rayleigh, Castle Point, Eastwood, Leigh on Sea and Southend) also donated £10,500 to help fund a prostate cancer treatment trial at Southend Hospital. This helped Southend Hospital make the pioneering treatment available to all in 2019.

Convention Venue
All convention events including the plenary sessions, exhibit hall, seminars, elections and the International Show will take place at the Palais des congrès de Montréal and the Bell Centre. The Palais des Congrès de Montréal is the largest and most versatile exhibition and meeting venue in Montreal.

• Registration fee up to January 7, 2022 is US \$175

• From April 1, 2022 and including on-site registration, the fee is US\$250
