
COLLECTION OF USED HEARING EQUIPMENT PROJECT.

It is over 30 years since Lions in the UK became involved in the Collection of Used Hearing Equipment Project. Lions have been collecting and sending in unwanted or broken analogue and digital hearing aids and audiological equipment.


Once received it is refurbished - cleaned and repaired. The refurbished hearing equipment is then sent abroad to support projects dedicated to assisting hearing impaired children and adults. People living in many countries have received help and include - Mexico, Egypt, Colombia, Chile, Peru, Senegal, Gambia, Sierra Leone, Liberia, Ghana, Nigeria, South Africa, Lesotho, Rwanda, Uganda, Tanzania, Malawi, Kenya, Ethiopia, Zanzibar, Madagascar, Ukraine, India, Nepal, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Burma, Cambodia, Vietnam, North Korea, China, Philippines, Djbuti and Papua New Guinea. When a hearing-impaired person receives refurbished hearing aids it opens up a whole new world to them and they can enjoy hearing the sounds of life we take for granted.

Dr Michael Nolan formerly of the Starkey Hearing Foundation receives donated hearing aids sorts it in to make and model, checks it and packs it ready for onward shipping or refurbishment. He also finds hearing impaired people abroad who can use this refurbished equipment.

LIONS ROAR 2023 – Programme Steps for Clubs Onboarding & helping schools through to success

Marketing and Introduction Pack

1. Get agreement that your Club is up for running the ROAR Programme and helping schools 2. Review the ROAR Programme details, contact Primary Schools and get their interest

3. Explain ROAR to schools, and gain their agreement to run the Programme 4. Ensure that School/s agree to run & fully resource the Programme


Admin Pack & Enrolment

5. Collect registration information for each school on form provided for your use 6. Forward £170 per school to your District Treasurer and Register on ROAR System (Typeform) 7. 8bi check Registration System, invoice Districts for registered schools. DTs pay 8bi invoice & pay MD Charities Treasurer for Programme Admin. 8. 8bi then enrol 'paid for' schools on to the LIONS ROAR 2023 System, send the Teacher Pack and provide system access to the schools

Introduction, Teacher Pack & Programme Execution

9. Schools & optionally Lions run LIONS ROAR Kick-Off, 8bi have 4 'check-ins' with schools (Sept / Oct / Day of Video / end Nov) 10. By mid-November schools run programme, select winners, award certificates & produce a video of the winning entry for District Finals

11. District Finals – end November, District teams review entries, select District Winners for the National Awards Day 12. LIONS ROAR National Awards Day – hosted by 8bi & Lions in December. District Winners are awarded certificates and Trophies

IMPORTANT CHANGES TO LIONS PORTAL

As you may have heard there are changes afoot with the Lions Portal (MyLCI). As from July there will be a new system introduced. Once I have further details, I shall be arranging some sessions for members to familiarize themselves with the new procedures.

> Before 15.6.2023 Enter all club officers for 2023-2024.

Before this date enter all service activities for events which took place prior to 1.6.2023. Reporting for events after that date will be carried out on the new system. record any club or personal donations to LCIF with appropriate documentation for recognition.

> Before 15.6.2023 Make sure that club data is accurate for 2022-23.

Make sure that every member has an email address.

Please note that shared email addresses cannot be used

in the new Lions Portal.

Make sure that members' birth dates are accurately recorded as these will be converted from MyLCI.HINT – in MyLCI under reports run 'Member Information Update Report' and get your members to update their info.

Late April Initial training is planned to begin!

7/15/23-7/24/23: Target Conversion Date

Before 6/15/23: Enter all club officers for 2023-2024

Before 6/15/23: Enter service activity for events prior to 6/1/23. Reporting for 6/1/23 going forward will be in the new system after conversion

Before 6/15/23: Record any club or donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognition.

Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL.
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!
- Training is slated to begin in late April 2023 Stay tuned!


