I had the pleasure of donating the cheque to Hanfia from Magic Breakfast at National HQ. I would like to say a HUGE thank you to all the Clubs and individuals who supported this cause during 2022 – 2023. We raised an amazing **£12,049.17** which equates to over **43,000 breakfasts** for kids. I would also like to take the opportunity to remind you how to support your local schools by gaining access to funding from Magic Breakfast. If a primary or secondary school has at least 35% of pupils eligible for Pupil Premium, then they can apply for funding. As Lions we can inform schools of this application process – and maybe take the opportunity to explain what else we can offer – further funding, Wild Tribe Heroes books, ROAR, volunteering to read to younger children, mock interviews with older children etc.

Beccles and District Lions Club

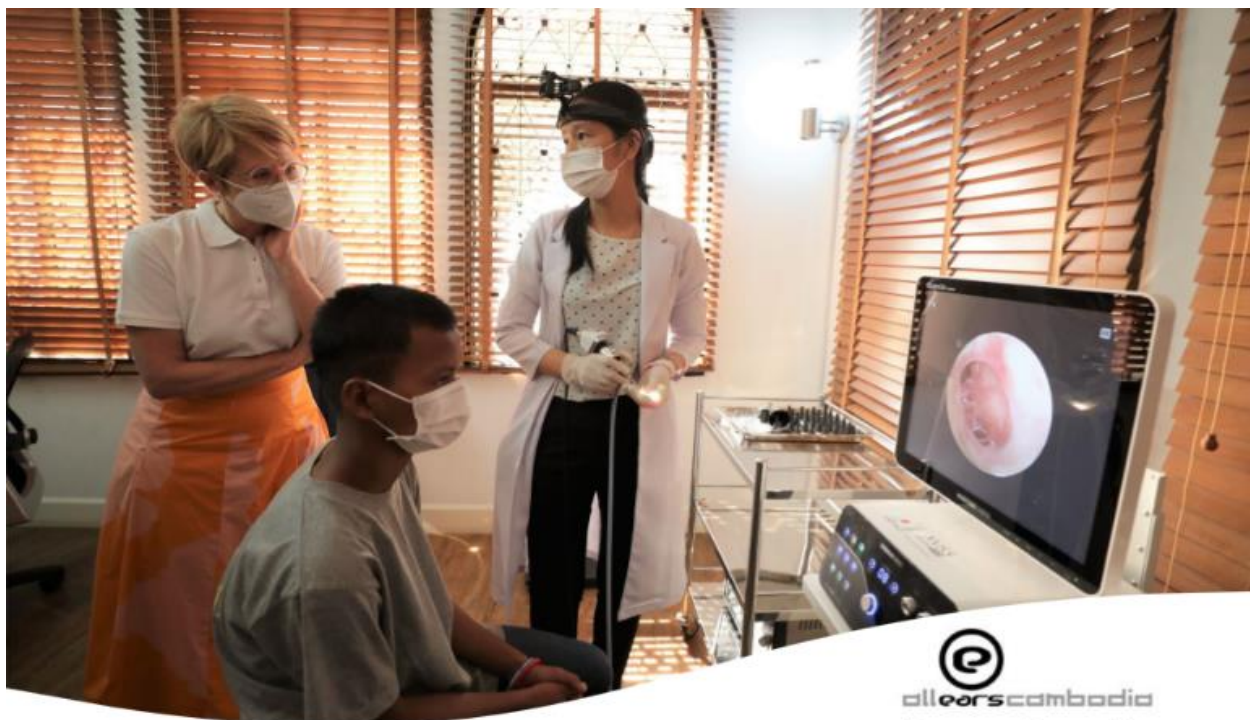
