

Old Leigh Shanty Weekend - Friday 19th to Sunday 21st May 2023



Members of the Hoy at Anchor Folk Club and **Leigh on Sea Lions Club** are organising a free community weekend of sea shanties, folk music, song, and dance in the atmospheric setting of Old Leigh Town.

There will be performances by shanty crews from as far afield as Felixstowe, Stony Stratford and Milton Keynes as well as local pirate bands, celebrated folk artistes and dancers.

The entertainment will take place at venues throughout the

atmospheric Old Town of Leigh thanks to the management and staff of The Crooked Billet, No 1 Cockleshed, The Peter Boat, Sara's Tea Gardens, The Boatyard Restaurant, Billet Wharf, The Old Smack and The Mayflower.
