The Deepings Lions

A prostate cancer awareness event, organised by The Deepings Lions in association with the charity Prostate Cancer UK and The Deepings Practice, took place on Saturday 27th May. The well attended event was held the Coronation Hall in Market at Tracy Taylor, from the charity started her talk by asking every eighth man in the audience to stand up, making a graphic illustration of the fact that 1 in 8 men will get prostate cancer. She described the risk factors and how her organisation can provide information and support including an on-line risk assessment. She also shared a moving personal story about her husband's experience with the disease. Dr Daniel Wade, a GP from The Deepings Practice,



described the symptoms of the disease and the importance of not ignoring them. He outlined the tests and procedures which are currently available for diagnosis and treatment. Early diagnosis providing better prospects for a successful outcome. Prostate Cancer is the most common cancer in men in the UK. It is important to know your risk.

Since Covid, we have found a new way to fundraise – Car Boot Sales - and these have been very popular with our members and raise a fantastic amount of funds for the Club. All our donations come from members of the public so cost us nothing, but we do get quite a lot of items that we know won't sell at car boots so what do we do with them? – sadly the 'really bad' bits do have to go to the tip, but if we can find items a new home then we do. We have been given hundreds of CD's and DVD's, boxes and boxes of books, broken jewellery, and good quality clothes to find new homes for. Some of the books go to the Jaywick Community Library, which is run by volunteers, others go to St Helena Hospice book shop in Frinton. CD's and DVD's go to the Jaywick Community Library, The St Helena Hospice Music shop in Frinton and to the Help Alexia walk charity. The clothes go to the CAB charity shop and the broken jewellery has been given to the local guide groups for craft work. Lion Liz our Fundraising Chairperson, registered as a donor at the St Helena Hospice shops and was very surprised when she received an – end of financial year - email from them saying that the proceeds from selling the goods we donated raised a fantastic total of £439.74 for their charity. A win win situation and less going to landfill.



After the success of the Golf Day last year, when we were raising money for the local Riding for the Disabled, LP Keith decided to organise another one and raise funds for another local charity Sonny's Army. Since founded 4 years ago they have helped 20,000 families that are living in hospitals across Essex with



emergency packs and financial support. The co-founders of Sonny's Army are Destiny Hannam – who was our District 105CE Young Ambassador for 2022 and her cousin Bobbie-Jean Cook is a Leo. A total of 48 golfers took to the green on a lovely sunny day, some had travelled from as far away as Cardiff in Wales, and PDG David Pope also joined us. A good day was had by all, starting with bacon roll and a hot drink, then the game itself and then another meal of ham egg and chips. There was also a raffle, and the golfers were very generous with all tickets being sold. We are still awaiting some funds to come in so do not have an exact figure raised yet but it will be over £1,000.
