There were winners from 6 Districts, including our own, but we were treated to presentations from 4 previous candidates, including last year's winner Khan Odita. At the point of announcing the winners, we heard that Imam Dar sponsored by ?? had won the Ship Shape Award and then that Isobel

Hallworth from 105SE had won the overall competition, however, unfortunately she will be too old to represent MD105 at Europa Forum, so they announced a 2nd place winner who was our very own candidate, Ashton Fulcher, representing 105CE, sponsored by New Century again (3 years in a row). Guess we will be going to Europa Forum again in October. Ashton makes and sells a wide range of items using second hand materials with the profits donated to charities such as GeeWhizz, East Anglia Children's Hospice (EACH) and Bumblebee Children's Charity.

Don't forget there are also opportunities for development via Certified Guiding Lion Courses, with a face to face one at Convention on Friday afternoon, plus the usual President, Secretary and Treasurer courses offered. On top of this there is a wealth of online courses available through MyLion Learning Zone which are just as useful for work as they are for Lions.

The DG team continue to show a selection of Lions Share reports as we visit clubs, these are always well received and we all feel that this approach should continue for the next few years, concentrating on various aspects of Lionism, the next one being fund raising. Chelmsford Lion Club

Chelmsford Lions Club started 2023 by working with the Bags of Taste charity, delivering food parcels and their lesson plans to people with a range of disadvantages by giving them practical support to teach them what to buy and cook to make tasty and affordable food. This has involved buying the food; packaging it; adding recipes and some basic equipment and delivering to our clients.

Our major project has been to a commence work to create a sensory garden for Barrow Farm Riding for the Disabled at Highwood. Lion Martin Wood is a trustee of this charity, established in 1976. It enables people with special needs and disabilities to develop and enrich their lives, providing supervised horse riding and carriage driving. There are paddocks, stables, and a large, covered riding centre that makes riding accessible for people who cannot be catered for by other riding schools. This arena can be used for horse shows and there are also outdoor riding opportunities using horses and ponies. Activities include 'Tea with a Pony' for residents of local care homes; hence the site accommodates a wide range of special needs that serves adults and children. The Farm aims to provide physiotherapy and exercise; a chance to learn; an opportunity to make new friends; build confidence and have fun.

The original garden, made 10 years ago, has trees and shrubs that surround it and blocked out an attractive view and much of the sunlight. The garden revamp is in memory of a young rider named Charlotte Jessop. Andrea Cooper, President of the Chelmsford Lions has designed a new garden, which will incorporate wheelchair access; sensory plants; water features; toys and raised beds, with seating for outdoor picnics. The physical work required includes removal of tall trees and shrubs; breaking up concrete; laying paving slabs, resin play areas; creating raised bed, and incorporating an accessible ramp for access.

The physical work involved is being carried out by Lions members on Sunday work teams, with support from a The Good Gym, tree surgeons, and building material suppliers, Chandlers. The photos depict recent work, but there will be more physical work to follow. To complete this project Chelmsford Lions will be donning their gardening gear and wellies, hefting spades and wheelbarrows, for some months to come.


