
We also had great help from some of our wonderful Leos from Great Yarmouth and Bungay. Together we can. Alone we cannot.

They were able to provide Dmitro with a special trike thanks to North Notts Lions having just such a trike in storage. Lion David took it to AJ's Cycle Shack in Epworth, and they spruced it up and gave it a good service to make it ready for action.

Dmitro and his Mum took delivery, and it has been used constantly around the town.

Dimitro has now started at one of our local Primary Schools and is doing well apart from his mobility.





We were talking with the school's Lion David Hollier takes over refurbished trike Head, Sean Woolley, and he said

he was desperate to get a motorised chair for Dimitro and could Isle Lions assist in any way. Having helped Dmitro already we are obviously keen to continue our support, if at all possible.

We are wondering if any club in the District happens to have such a chair available for a growing 5 year old, controlled by a joystick and suitable for a school environment? Or do they know where a 2nd hand one could be sourced?

This is the style of chair needed and it would make such a difference to this young lad's education chances, and it's always good to work hand in hand with our fellow Lions!
