This new project involves cooperation between 3 NGOs: AEC, Khmer Sight Foundation and METU. It aims to detect and treat visual, auditory, speech and cognitive disorders in schoolchildren across Phnom Penh and the Mekong lowlands.

Medical intervention may involve primary eye/ear care, prescription glasses for refractive errors, hearing aids for hearing loss or therapy for children with speech or social-communication disorders. Fundraising has just begun and we are targeting the US charity sector specifically. We aim to launch the project in 2024.

Multisensory screening of schoolchildren



Newborn hearing screening programme

This year, we launched the first comprehensive neonatal hearing screening programme in the history of Cambodia. AEC works in partnership with the neonatology department of Sonja Kill Memorial Hospital, a nonprofit hospital in Kampot.

The pilot project aims to meet the globally recognized 1-3-6 target: to screen by 1 month of age, diagnose by 3 months and fit hearing aids by 6 months of age. In 2023, 974 babies screened were screened by SKMH/AEC with one baby found to have severe sensori-neural hearing loss and hearing aids fitted.

Project Echo

This project is a 3-year programme developing paediatric services across three regions: Phnom Penh, Siem Reap and Kratie. The aim is to improve children's hearing aid fitting protocols, communication therapy services and to refine hearing aid benefit evaluation.

The team has provided public health education to over 24,000 children since the project began. All have been screened for ear disease. There have been 1,371 audiological assessments and 185 hearing aids fitted.

The 60s Up Project is about helping older Khmers with hearing loss. It provides community hearing aid services in Phnom Penh, establishes self-help groups and local domiciliary services for the house-bound. It's innovative as it's achieved by working with the monks of local wats (or Buddhist temples). The wats are community focal points for many older people as there are no other communal centres for the elderly in Cambodia.

60s Up!

The ageing process is the commonest cause of inner ear damage in adults. Most people over sixty are affected. We create awareness of age-related hearing loss for older people and we offer hearing aids for those in need of them.



We also run a similar service for the cyclo drivers of Phnom Penh.

The cyclo drivers work long hours and earn very little and many use their vehicles as beds to save money. They're amongst the poorest of the urban poor in Cambodia. Again, we help create awareness of ear health and we offer services for those in need.

60s Up and beyond...





We lost one doctor and two senior primary ear care clinicians to the private sector during the year.

There were fresh beginnings, however, for 3 new medical doctors (2 are ENT specialists) and 2 junior primary ear care clinicians who all began work at AEC in 2023.

We are reviewing ways to improve employee benefits and safeguard retention of staff.



AEC Phnom Penh now runs a specialist dizziness clinic which is open to all. In 2013, we improved physiological diagnostics by introducing videonystagmography testing as well as effective rehabilitation measures to counter the stressful and disabling effects of vestibular disease.

Vertigo and balance-related conditions are among the most common health problems in adults. Examples of commonly-presenting diseases causing vertigo include labyrinthitis, benign paroxysmal positional vertigo, vestibular neuritis, Manière's disease and persistent postural perceptive dizziness.

Specialist therapy services

AEC's paediatric hearing rehabilitation programme is now supported with a speech and language advisory service, auditory verbal therapy and family counselling.

All families of children newly diagnosed with hearing loss receive help through these services.

Music therapy is also used to help improve cognitive and language development, psychological well-being and the development of speech and auditory skills.
