Chelmsford Lion Club Summer review and Autumn programme

A new Sensory Garden at Barrow Farm Riding School for the Disabled at Highwood is nearing completion. Past President Andrea Cooper has designed, and project managed construction of this landscaping project with input by volunteers from Chelmsford Lions Club, the Good Gym, and the Riding School. The work involved clearing trees from the site against the Eastern elevation of the Main Indoor Riding School Arena, then removing paths and hard core to create a pleasant, landscaped garden with a ramp down from the Arena building leading into a new patio with seating surrounded by attractive planting. It incorporates wheelchair access with accessible raised planters to enable the school's users and their families to have an enjoyable outdoor experience with picnics; 'tea with a pony' and outdoor space when there are competitions.

During the summer, our annual charter was held in June. Our charity work included supporting Diabetes UK at the Great Dunmow Soap Box Derby; Farleigh Hospice at Maldon Splash Out and having a stand at the Writtle Fair. Support for Well-being has included funds given to the Wilderness Foundation to promote the Environment for young people; giving out blood stab kits to Riverside Leisure Centre and several Chelmsford pubs; as well as distributing 'Message in a Bottle' that paramedics use to identify medication needs of older vulnerable persons at a recent Sting tribute concert in Witham.

During July we took part in the Chelmsford Carnival activities that coincided with a visit from Narbonne Lions. 'Preparation for our entry into Chelmsford's Eco carnival took some weeks and we took advantage of space in a pop-up shop to raise the profile of the club as we built our 'float' on a handcart, accompanied by our own Lion. The float comprised a 'pyramid' adorned in Lions blue and red with our emblem, displaying different areas of service: spectacle recycling, fruit and veg gleaning and Message in a Bottle, topped off with a globe and national flags representing our international organisation. With our French connection, one of our French visitors functioned as 'Monsieur Le Starter' at our Pig Race in Oakland Park. Subsequently, after treating our French visitors to Boules on the beach at Frinton-on-Sea, we held our Presidents' Changeover from Andrea Cooper to Jim Thomas.

Our Autumn programme has included a Fashion Show at John Lewis's Chelmsford store generating funds for a Well-being charity called Grapevine serving the Over 18s with learning

disabilities, a The Fashion Show was a first for Chelmsford Lions Club and a roaring success, raising more than £1300. The club worked closely with retail staff who helpfully supported the event, which featured clothing from their autumn collections, worn by models from both our club and the charity. One hundred Attendees enjoyed a welcoming glass of Prosecco and a goody bag before then watching an afternoon of themed fashion that included casual daywear and the all-important evening wear, vital to any 'Lion about town.'

We also held Rock 'n Roll Curry evening in aid of the homeless charity Chelmsford Lions Club. Ongoing community has included spectacle collection, helping Havens Hospice to Marshall Chelmsford Marathon,

and continuing to raise funds. Coming shortly, we plan to contribute to Chelmsford Community Radio commencing in November and to get Santa's Sleigh out once again for his

Christmas tour of Chelmsford.
