THIS YEAR'S CHARITY APPEAL BY SUE, THE WIFE OF THE DISTRICT GOVERNOR.



The charity I have chosen this year as the wife of the District Governor for 2023/2024 is Cardiomyopathy UK.

I have chosen this charity as this is condition is something I have been aware of for many years. This charity has helped to save and improve the lives of people affected by Cardiomyopathy and they also raise awareness of the condition.

Cardiomyopathy is a disease of the heart muscle, this isn't a single condition, but a group of conditions that affect the structure of the

heart and reduce its ability to pump blood around the body. It can affect anyone at any age, and it is thought to affect around 270,000 people in the UK, which is around one in 250 people.

There are different types of Cardiomyopathies which vary depending on how they affect the heart muscle. If you would like further information, please contact Paul and we will send you further information.

There are many possible causes of Cardiomyopathy. Some types are genetic, caused by a mutation in the person's DNA which affects how their heart develops. Genetic conditions may be inherited, passed from parent to child, so Cardiomyopathy sometimes runs in families. Often if one person is diagnosed with Cardiomyopathy it is recommended that their close family members such as parents, siblings, and children, known as first degree relatives, are tested for the condition too.

Other causes include viral infections, autoimmune diseases (which affect the immune system), and some medications such as some used to treat cancer.

At Cardiomyopathy UK they offer help and support for anyone affected by this condition.

Fifty years ago, a little girl I knew was happily riding along on her scooter with her friend when she collapsed. That little girl never woke up.

At the time Cardiomyopathy was not a known condition, however several years later her older sister too was diagnosed and then later, her older brother. He subsequently passed away after a failed heart transplant. His children have spent many years having annual check-ups down in London, however in the last couple of years genetic testing has become available for this condition. His three daughters are now aware that they carry the gene and subsequently their children are now being offered genetic testing.

Although they carry the gene, they are at an advantage in that they are <u>aware</u>. There are those who are not aware, collapse and never wake up.

Cardiomyopathy UK Improves awareness of this condition, improves diagnosis, and access to quality treatment and provide hope for the future.

Why are most men unwilling to visit their doctor or confront possible warning signs? Why do so many men rarely attend cancer screening events put on for their enefit?

It is time for men to take the initiative and to begin to look after their own health.

There are numerous cancers which affect men including prostate, lung, liver, bowel, testicular breast and skin cancers. The good news is that there are screening opportunities for some of these conditions and Lions Clubs are already helping organise such opportunities.

Throughout the Multiple District, many Clubs have successfully arranged PSA Tests for men. Such a test is a quick and simple procedure and has identified many men in need of further examination.

If, as a Club, you are unable to arrange a specific type of screening check for ones near you and at least help promote them - not only in your Club but in your locality.

Until men become accustomed to talking about themselves, looking after themselves and checking their own health status, the problems will only intensify.

What can Ladies do to help?

Support your man and encourage him to attend a screening if there is one local to you and encourage him to check himself on a regular basis. I am sure the majority of you check yourself, so please encourage your man to check himself and do support him should his prognosis be less than positive.

Because I have been there and have successfully come through the experience.


