We were delighted when she asked us to be there to do a bucket collection for our Club funds. While collecting there, Lion President Paula presented her with a Certificate of Appreciation to say Thank You for the support she (and her husband Richard) has, and continues to show us.







Morrisons Store in Little Clacton has supported Clacton Lions for many years (over 25) and to show our appreciation, when we take our Christmas Hamper Draw to their store, we donate 50% of the profits to their chosen charity – which is currently Together for Short Lives. This is the only supermarket that allows us to collect in the store itself, rather than the foyer and this was most

appreciated as the temperatures dropped drastically in the days we were there. Operational Manager Luke picked the winning tickets and Lion President Paula presented them to the lucky winners.

The Asda superstore opened its doors in Clacton seven years ago go and since day one has supported Clacton Lions. Again, to show our appreciation we also donate 50% of the profits from our Christmas Hamper Draw to the charity of their choice, and this year (also last year) they donated it to our Presidents Chosen Charity. Last year it was The Lions Brain Tumour Research Appeal and this year it is Sailship Training and Learning for Life. With temperatures of minus one, our members braved the 'rather chilly'



Carols for Everyone rocks Southwell Minster and raises £2,500 for Maggies' Centre

Southwell Minster was filled with festive cheer on 9th December when the crowds packed in to celebrate the coming of Christmas at the Carols for Everyone community celebration.

Carols for Everyone has been held every year, except in 2020, the pandemic due, for over 40 years and has been organised by the Lions since 2001. A mixture of favourite carols, seasonal music and special performances, the mainstays of the concert are the Southwell Orchestral and Choral Societies, conducted this year for the first time by internationally acclaimed baritone and former Southwell chorister Marcus Farnsworth. The event was once again compered by the great Nick Harding.

Additional entertainment was provided by the ever-reliable Southwell U3A Recorder Group and the enchanting choir from Holy Trinity Infant School, many of whose members joined in the Lions' energetic rendition of 'The twelve days of Christmas', complete with almost all the actions. New Organ Scholar Tim Selman treated us to a rousing rendition of 'Bring a torch, Jeanette, Isabella' by Denis Bédard.

Every year, Carols for Everyone supports a deserving local or international charity. This year, we chose Maggie's Centre in Nottingham to be our nominated charity. Maggie's, based in the heart of the City Hospital in Nottingham, provides a warm and welcoming space for people to go for shelter from the clinical, sometimes stressful environment of the hospital after their own cancer diagnosis or that of a family member or a friend. Understanding every person's individual circumstances is central to what they do, so they can guide them to the support that will help the most.



Thanks to all those who bought tickets and their amazing generosity in the closing collection, we raised, after expenses, nearly £2,500, all of which goes to Maggie's Centre.

As well as our thanks to the performers, we must



also thank The Dean, for permission to use the Minster, The Minster vergers and staff, the Minster Concert Stewards, the Minster Bellringers, the Cathedral Shop for selling tickets and everyone who displayed a poster.

But, most of all, thank you to everyone who came out on a cold, wet night to support Maggie's Centre and Southwell Lions' Carols for Everyone Christmas Concert. We hope to see you all again on 7th December 2024!

Finally for 2023 we took to the surrounding communities with our Sant's Sleigh and the generosity shown was heartwarming. Many children were so excited to converse with Santa. The sentiment shown by many adults ranged from, "at last Christmas has begun now that the sleigh is here!" to many reminiscing on their own childhood remembering the sleigh visits when they were children.
