21st & 22nd November 2020

Purpose:

The main aim is to bring together younger/younger in service members for a wide-ranging discussion, encourage lateral thinking, to obtain the views of the next generation of leaders within MD105, to inform our thinking for the next 5 to 10 years.

We need to ensure that what we do in our MD is relevant to today's society.

This may be first entry level experience of leadership topics and for many, club level responsibility may be the next step. Depending on length of service a District role may be more appropriate and will be very much down to every individual, local needs, and development opportunities.

Number:

Budget has been prepared to allow a maximum 40 participants based on 5 attendees from every District and with a limit of 2 attendees from any club.

Contributions:

Financially - Hotel and refreshments will be within MD105 Budget and it is anticipated that travel will be met by each District.

Additional nights may either be District or personal expense to be agreed in advance.

Personally - each attendee will need to be willing to prepare some advance information, participate and contribute to discussions and show a willingness to benefit from the learning opportunity.

Follow up:

Each District will be asked to identify a mentor who will continue to develop the attendees. A one-day follow up workshop for attendees and mentors to discuss progress and future needs will be organised. Experience does suggest that there is willingness and enthusiasm on the part of the attendees to take on responsibilities appropriate to their level of experience. Caveat on appropriate. We do not wish to overburden the willing.

Symposium:

Will run from 10.00 on Saturday through to 15.30 (latest) on Sunday. Attendees will be expected to attend all sessions including evening dinner.

MD105 will be providing accommodation, meals, and refreshments for the duration of the Symposium only (Saturday/Sunday).

Arrival on Friday night can be arranged directly with the hotel and details will be part of the confirmation letter to all attendees. This will be personal choice, and many will arrive on Saturday.

Programme:

There is no formal agenda as the programme is very much driven by the needs of the attendees.

There will be a steer towards:

- Change - what do we need to change/what can we change/ how can we change
- Diversity
- Difficult people - discussion on strategies and needs of newer younger lions
- Conflict Resolution
- Communication
